	girls. All support needs are considered. Pets are also considered on a	
	case-by-case basis. Each room consist of a bedroom and an on suite	
	bathroom. There are shared kitchen and laundry facilities in each of the	
	clusters of either 3 or 5 rooms. 5 of the respite rooms are for women	
	who have no recourse to public funds. Meals are not provided;	
	however, food vouchers will be provided for those with no recourse to	
	public funds. The assessment and reconnection workers at WWSS will
