TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

The Trustees (who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act) present their annual report together with the financial statements of Groundswell Network Support UK (the company) for the ended 31 March 2013. The Trustees confirm that the Annual report and financial statements of the company comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

a. Constitution

The company is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee, company number 4151312 and was set up by a Memorandum of Association on 8 January 2001.

The company is constituted under a Memorandum of Association dated 8 January 2001and is a registered charity number 1089987.

b. Structure and governance

Groundswell was originally created in 1996 as a project within National Homeless Alliance (now Homeless Link), gaining independence by registering as a charitable company limited by guarantee in January 2001.

In April 2012, Groundswell entered into a formal partnership with Thames Reach, an Industrial & Provident Society and exempt charity, who was appointed to be the sole Member of the charity. This partnership enables both organisations to better fulfil their missions and is characterised by co-operation and proactively working together to enhance services with homeless people.

c. Method of appointment or election of trustees

The management of the company is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Articles of Association. The Trustees perform the role of directors in company law and of trustees in charity law. Those who served during the period are listed on page 1. The minimum number of Trustees is four, with a maximum of 12.

There are three routes to become a Groundswell Trustee. Firstly, the Volunteer Forum - which is open to all who volunteer with Groundswell - elects two representatives to the Board. Secondly, the Member may nominate up to two Trustees to join Groundswell's Board, with this ideally including, as is currently the case, one Trustee and one Senior Manager of Thames Reach. The remaining Trustees are recruited openly.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

a. Policies and Objectives

Our Mission: Groundswell exists to enable homeless and vulnerable people to take more control of their lives, have a greater influence on services and to play a full role in our community.

Our Core Beliefs:

Inclusive solutions! The only way to genuinely tackle homelessness and social exclusion is by utilising the knowledge and expertise of people affected by these issues.

There is no Them & Us - only Us! Groundswell brings everyone together to create effective solutions.

Involvement works! When everyone is involved the process creates more effective services and enables people to regain their independence.

We believe in people! People are society's most valuable resource, and everyone has the capacity to make a contribution.

The whole community benefits when we effectively tackle homelessness and social exclusion.

Organisational Vision 2012-15: Groundswell, in partnership with Thames Reach, to be the leading advocacy organisation working in homelessness. Delivering effective and innovative projects that put homeless people at the heart of solutions to homelessness. Within a high quality, inclusive and sustainable framework.

b. Activities and Acheivements

Peer Advocacy. 2012-13 saw major growth and development for Groundswell's Homeless Health Peer Advocacy (HHPA) service – which improves homeless people's access to healthcare - primarily through being accompanied to health appointments by volunteer peer advocates – who themselves have personal experience of homelessness.

HHPA began in Westminster in 2010-11, growing to a second borough in 2011-12 and last year grew to operating in six London boroughs (Westminster, Camden, Lambeth, Hammersmith and Fulham, Kensington and Chelsea, and Hackney). During the year people experiencing homelessness were supported to attend 838 appointments – with an attendance rate of 86%.

Additionally we ran 337 Health Promotion In Reach session weeks – bringing health professionals into hostels and day centres.

We also continue to operate our TB Peer Education Project in partnership with Find & Treat's Mobile X-Ray Unit - training and supporting a group of peer educators with personal experience of homelessness, and in recovery from TB, to empower currently homeless people to be screened for TB. In 2012-13 Groundswell peer educators supported over 7,000 people to be screened for TB.

Participatory Action Research. Last year we completed the three-year participatory action research project: Aiming High: Sport for All, aimed at enabling homelessness services to develop and deliver opportunities for sport, coordinated by Homeless Link and funded by the Football Foundation. "The project's success was largely down to the depth of understanding gained through Groundswell's programme of peer research." Sport For All Final Evaluation

Through the year we also completed the multi-year Working Mothers Project with Inclusion and Women Like Us; delivered a Client Audit for our partner organisation Thames Reach; a peer research investigation with Riverside ECHG into how a new service Outreach Buddies could enable people with experience of rough sleeping contribute to the work of street outreach teams; and completed and disseminated The Good Practice Guide for the Homeless People's Commission - a technique Groundswell developed to enable people experiencing homelessness to contribute meaningfully to policy making.

Volunteers. Volunteers with personal experience of homelessness have always been at the heart of Groundswell's work. It was with great pride that we learned that Jimmy Carlson, our longest serving volunteer with 16 years' service, was awarded an OBE for Services to Combatting Homelessness in the Queen's Birthday Honours list.

With Groundswell Jimmy has trained hundreds of workers and service users in client involvement and spoken

at numerous conferences, including a speech at the inaugural International Conference on Health, Homelessness and Inclusion this year. Jimmy was involved in delivering the Self-Help Forums and Speakouts of Groundswell's early years as well being the driving force in creating the Homeless People's Commission. Jimmy also helped set up numerous client led initiatives including the Haven Club – a social club for people in recovery and ICDAS - the client involvement group for clients of substance misuse services in Islington; both of which he chaired for many years. He also contributed to the two organisations that helped him out of homelessness – serving as an Advisor to the Board of the Alcohol Recovery Project and helped set up Outside In - the client group at St Mungos. All this following 23 years of homelessness.

Jimmy's remarkable achievements made five national newspapers and features on BBC TV News and radio, where he was able to his spread his heartfelt beliefs to a broad audience: "The only way to genuinely tackle homelessness is with the direct involvement of homeless people!" and "Never give up on anyone!"

Groundswell's organisational priority to further develop our support to volunteers was met through the employment of our first Volunteer Support Manager — ensuring that volunteers were better supported to progress out of homelessness. In the last three years 17 of our volunteers with experience of homelessness have now moved into employment. We ran a Volunteer Admin Trainee supporting two volunteers to learn administration skills. Outcomes included one NVQ in Business Administration and one full-time job as an Administrator. We also successfully created a new Volunteer Forum to enable volunteers, past and present to come together to input into Groundswell's development; influence policy and create mutual peer support mechanisms.

c. Public Benefit

The Groundswell Trustees have taken account of Section 17 (5) of the Charities Act and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 which requires them to have regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission when exercising their duties. They state that the activities delivered by Groundswell in 2012-13, described above, directly further Groundswell's charitable objects and that these activities have been undertaken for the public benefit.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

a. Finance

Groundswell achieved an income of £448,277, an increase of 11.3% on the previous financial year and our largest ever income.

There was a surplus for the year of £16,453 and reserves stood at £59,778, all of which was in respect of Unrestricted Funds.

b. Staff

During 2012-13 Groundswell employed a total of 8.4 full-time equivalent staff. This comprised twelve individuals through the year in a range of full-time and part-time roles. Five of the twelve have personal experience of homelessness.

c. Reserves policy

Groundswell's reserves policy is to aim to achieve by April 2015 a target of four months of running costs, including overheads and salaries. At 31 March 2013 our reserves of £59,778 were 64% of this target.

FUTURE PLANS

Groundswell's unique take on peer advocacy is very successful, with proven benefits for five clear groups: people currently experiencing homelessness - by providing access to services and improvements to health; our volunteers - supporting people on their journey out of homelessness; homelessness services - contributing to the role of key workers and with our in-reach work helping create positive dynamics in hostels and day centres; health services - through increasing staff understanding and ability to work with people experiencing homelessness; and the public purse - achieving cost savings through reducing expenditure.

Groundswell sees further developments of our Homeless Health Peer Advocacy service as a key to the future of the organisation, with an increased level of delivery already secured for 2013-14.

Through our peer advocacy work Groundswell has developed a clear and practical way for people with experience of homelessness to support to each other and be involved in solutions to homelessness, and we believe that this work offers an impactful and sustainable way for Groundswell to continue to fulfil our mission.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees have considered the charity's day to day cash flow requirements and have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and financial statements.

1.2 Company status

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The company is administred by the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 by Thames Reach who is the sole member of the company.

1.3 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the company and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the company for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of financial activities when the company is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the company and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is made except in those cases where the offer is conditional, such grants being recognised as expenditure when the conditions attaching are fulfilled. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £500 are capitalised.

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

1.7 Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to the Statement of financial activities as incurred.

1.8 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.

1.9 Welfare Loans

Small welfare loans from the restricted funds are treated as recoverable unless the Trustees decide they should be written off.
