| Adult social care / safeguarding teams | <ul> <li>Adult social care should be contacted if an adult's needs meet all three of these conditions:</li> <li>1. the person's needs arise from or are related to a physical or mental impairment or illness</li> <li>2. the person's needs make them unable to achieve two or more specified outcomes (below)</li> <li>3. as a result of being unable to meet these outcomes, there is likely to be a significant impact on the adult's wellbeing</li> </ul> | A needs assessment/ case conference may be scheduled with services involved with the client, if further discussion is needed. | Adult services team: 020 7641 1444 Email: adultsocialcare@westminster.gov. uk |

| Monthly Enhanced Vulnerability Forum (for Rough Sleepers) (EVF) | Problem solving forum for rough sleepers and clients accessing the rough sleeping pathway, with high risk, often escalating health and mental health concerns.  The principal theme of clients discussed will be those that have "fallen through cracks" and/ or been very resistant to change.  The meeting will seek to review actions taken thus far, propose and track solutions as well as escalate cases that are deemed to require further review or that may need statutory decisions appealed. | Hoarding and Self Neglect MDT (lead agency should schedule when required) | An MDT should be organised where an adult has been identified as  • self-neglecting or where hoarding behaviours have put them or others at risk which could result in significant harm  The lead agency should schedule a multi-disciplinary meeting to determine the most favourable approach for achieving engagement with the adult. This is to provide co-ordinated response and guidance to operational staff and managers on how to address the needs of difficult to engage adults living in Westminster who hoard or self-neglect. | <ul> <li>The following services are suggested:</li> <li>Housing service and building owner (if different)</li> <li>Residential Environmental Health</li> <li>Adult Social Care</li> <li>Westminster Mental Health Services</li> <li>Westminster Housing commissioners</li> <li>Community Health teams</li> <li>London Fire Brigade</li> </ul> | The lead agency working with the client will need to set up the MDT on case-by-case basis. Inform lead commissioner to get extra support in contacting services. |
| Integrated Care<br>Network (monthly)<br>– last Tuesday in<br>the month    | The Integrated care network (ICN) forum is attended by members of the core multi-disciplinary team. | The Westminster<br>Violence Against<br>Women and Girls<br>(VAWG) and MD<br>forum | The Westminster Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) and multiple disadvantage forum is a space where professionals working in homelessness services in Westminster can bring the cases of women they are supporting for both reflective discussion and practical advice around issues such as violence, abuse and trauma.
